Typically, that search begins with a tractor. And, on a horse farm, that often means a tractor ranging between 25 and 115 horsepower, depending on the acreage and work that needs to be done. Selecting and using the right size and configured tractor, is essential to making sure it's compatible with your other equipment and, just as important, your expectations.

Horsepower is important, but so are tractor size, hydraulic capacity, PTO performance and other features that help you work the way you want. Will you be on uneven ground, pulling something heavy part of the time or running on softer soil? Then four-wheel drive might be an important consideration versus two-wheel drive. Will you be operating in cold or hot weather? How could a cab impact your comfort and efficiency versus a tractor with an open station? And you'll need to think about your transmission, too. Do you want a hydrostatic transmission, which is highly-efficient and easy-to-use, even for operators without much tractor driving experience? Or do you want a geared transmission with a PowrReverser™ that helps make no-stop, clutch-less direction changes easier during loader chores?

Hydraulic capacity is also an important consideration. Operating a tractor with lower hydraulic capacity and slower cycling time means you'll waste more time waiting for the attachments to raise and lower instead of working. Having additional hydraulic selective control valves (SCVs) makes it easier to hook up and utilize any number of implements such as loaders and backhoes.

The choices are nearly endless, making it easier to match the tractor to your chores, lifestyle and budget. That's exactly why John Deere has developed a range of tractors perfectly suited to horse owners and the properties for which they often care. This includes the 1 through 5 Family Tractors, which fit right into the horsepower range required for typical horse farm and large property chores: mowing, digging, hauling, brush clearing, loader work, grading, baling, and other utility chores.

For smaller acreages, for example, the popular and affordable John Deere 3E Series with up to 38 engine horsepower, or the 4M Series Utility Tractors, which range from 44 to 66 engine horsepower, are ideal for mowing, maintaining driveways, digging postholes and loader work. For larger properties and jobs, there are six models of 3- and 4-cylinder John Deere 5E Tractors available, from 45 to 100 hp, each easily handling haying, bale moving, pasture mowing and more demanding jobs.

If you need something more nimble and are taking care of just a few acres, the 1 and 2 Family tractors – with horsepower



ranging from 23 to 31.7 – might be just right. Both feature drive-over mower decks that help speed attachment and removal of the deck. They are compatible with backhoes, loaders and other implements designed to maximize productivity.

When it comes to servicing and maintaining your tractor, you should consider how often your tractor will need service and what service points need to be managed. This can dramatically increase the long-term cost of ownership as well as your downtime. John Deere tractors feature longer service intervals to reduce that downtime as well as your maintenance costs. They also have easy-to-access filters and other service items so you can get to them quickly and be on your way.
